#### **Newsletter Week 6 Term 1 2018**

Hello everyone,

We only have a few weeks to go until this very short term concludes, but what a busy few weeks it will be with the teachers and students pushing hard to improve reading, writing and numeracy in every classroom across the school. We have used 28 school days and now left with only 172 to improve student learning.

Next week we will have our Annual General meeting of School Council, where all positions will be spilled and the next council leadership will be elected to help guide the school through the rest of 2018. The school council at its last meeting approved the first day of Term 2 and Term 3 as student free days,  $16^{th}$  of April and  $16^{th}$  of July, so that teachers can improve their practice and thus provide better skills to your children.

Parent teacher interviews will be held on Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> of March from 4:00pm to 8:00pm and the following day, Thursday 29<sup>th</sup> from 8:30am to 1:00pm. As always if you and your child have an interview on the Wednesday evening they will not be required here on the Thursday as teachers will be continuing the interviews of their classmates. To book a time parents will have to access compass in the coming week or ring the office. A reminder that these interviews only happen twice a year and it is a valuable opportunity to speak to your child's teacher about how they have settled into their new grade and the plan for their learning going forward.

Last week I had the pleasure of taking 13 students to the division swimming carnival. It was a great day with the children performing and behaving brilliantly. Congratulations to John Junge and Teanna Kilby who have made it through to the next round. The Regional Swimming Championships will be held in Sale on Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> of March.

Yesterday we had 4 students, Sally Hoffman, Cooper Rowe, Lawson Ward and Tristian Rose Greaves, represented the school at the District Tennis Championships. Congratulations to Sally Hoffman who will participate at the Regional Competition in Traralgon on 26th April.



## How to place a Lunch Order

Write the lunch order on a clean brown paper bag and remember to include: Child's name, Class and room number.

Place the money inside the bag and try to include the 'correct amount' If you require change - it will be placed in the bag and returned to your child with their lunch.

The Class Monitor takes the basket to the Office in the moming at 9.00am, and then collects the basket from the canteen at first break to be delivered to the classroom.
