Week 1 Term 3

Good afternoon and welcome back to week 1 of term 3. We talk about term 3 as being the "moving term", where the children really start to accelerate their learning. I need to welcome on board both **Anita Padula and Kassandra Collins**, who both have their first day at 754 today. Anita is providing the Multi Cultural program and Kassandra will be PE for the first 3 weeks of term, whilst Nick O'Brien is on leave.

I would like to also remind people that the School Council is seeking feedback around the use of the **BEEC**, the block out at Granite Rock. The block has fallen into a state of disrepair and we need to make some decisions around its future. You are able to provide feedback in two ways:

Last term the students from Grades 4, 5 & 6 completed the annual **Attitudes to School Survey**, and the results came back to the school on Monday – They are Fantastic – Superdapulious - Magnifico!

The survey covers aspects of 5 main areas:

Effective Teaching Practise, Teacher – Student relationships, Learning Characteristics, Social Engagement and Student Safety, all from the perspective of the 4, 5 and 6 students. In all there are 17 elements, our results indicate growth from last year and we have ranked in the top 95% of the state! Go us! This is an extremely pleasing result and reflects an excellent light on the work we are doing. The full survey will be unpacked both at School Council and with the students, it is their story to tell and the feedback is important.

Community Consultation Night - This night will occur on Wednesday the 25th of July. This is week 2 of Term 3. (As was advertised in the newsletters last term) This event has been so successful over the last 2 years, that we have decided to make it an annual event. on many aspects of the school. Each table for discussion will have a Principal from another school in our area, a staff member from 754, a student or two, a member of

our school council and of course parents. I will pose a series of questions to the table for discussion and then we follow up the feedback given. If you could please contact the office to let us know your intention to come along, then we will more easily be able to cater (nibbles) and arrange table numbers. Thanks!

Something to ponder: During the break I was listening to Michelle Obama speaking about education. 
