PARENTING CHILDREN WHO WORRY TOO MUCH

A FREE PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT SESSION FOR PARENTS OR THOSE SUPPORTING PARENTS

This FREE 90-minute session provides parents and those working with children or families with an overview of what works best for kids who worry. Based on Australian and overseas research this interactive seminar outlines some practical ideas for equipping children to manage anxious feelings. These tools are useful life-long (and good for parents to use too!) Presenter Helen Rimington is an educator with a special interest in mental health and parenting who has worked in this area for two decades. There will also be resources available at no cost to take home.

The session is presented by Save the Children, as part of the East Gippsland Children's Wellbeing Initiative, in conjunction with drummond street services.

Supervised activities will be provided for pre-school children.
