Hats on in Term 1, 2 and 4



Hello everyone,

Welcome to week two. Yesterday three of our students, Kyle, Autumn and Korie attended the Regional Athletics at Newborough. Both Kyle and Autumn gained 5th places for their events and Korie came 8th in his event. Well done to the students for competing and representing Bairnsdale Primary School in such a responsible, respectful and resilient way. Thank you to Mrs Tromp for taking Autumn and Korie down to the Newborough as I was unable to do so.

Our first School Council Meeting for term 4 is happening tomorrow at 6:00pm, where Ms Nagle will outline the data sets (NAPLAN, attendance, parent, student and staff surveys) that the Department looks at to judge how well we are progressing. As I have published in previous newsletters our NAPLAN results were outstanding. Our 3 surveys have gone from being very poor to excellent in the last 2 years and our absences have been more than halved for each student on average from 22 days each to 11. All this has lead to the school being recognised in very high regional discussions and several of our staff asked to present at a conference on how we achieved these great results.



The Preps to Grade 4 had a great start to the swimming program on Monday with all the students thoroughly enjoying the lessons. In the new BARC setup the students had to navigate through the side entrance to get to the change rooms. There will be no swimming next week as we have a pupil free day and the program will recommence on Monday 29th of October.

Next Monday (22nd October) is a **student free day** as we are welcoming over 25 other teachers, ES staff and principals to be a part of the professional development day around Fontus and Perrnel. This assessment tool will more accurately assess the students reading performance and give teachers information on how to take your child to the next step to improve their reading. We thank you for understanding about this, as it is a vital tool that will help your child learn and become better readers.



Great news, all the students will be rejoicing, the Disco is finally Going to be held on the 25th of October, which is next Thursday evening. I am hoping to see all the students there showing their best dance moves.
