Principal's Message Week 6 Term 4

Good afternoon everyone.

What a busy few weeks we have had at 754!

With a fantastic few days at Camp Coolamatong last week to the Grade 5/6 students sailing down in Paynesville this week. From all reports the sailing was very successful. I believe there were only a few boats that were upturned accidentally. I'm so pleased the weather was warm for the students.

Today being Remembrance Day saw a group of students head out to the War Cemetery to take part in a Remembrance Day Service. Thank you to Miss Anngela Bell for organising this wonderful experience (see photo next page).

This afternoon all students were involved in a webinar, teaching the students about Wadawurrung Culture. Ranger Ebonee, a proud Wadawurrung woman and Parks Victoria ranger working on Country, shared the importance of place and cultural connections. Our students learned the significance of Wurdi Youang (You Yangs) to the Wadawurrung people and the respectful and sustainable approaches to living on Country. Ebonee also discussed the purpose of traditional tools, showed examples of shelters and explained the use of the Rock Well located on top of Big Rock.

This week staff have been working hard with our students on a variety of aspects in our 754 Primary School Expectations Matrix. We have seen some wonderful examples of students being Respectful, Resilient and Responsible. Please take a few minutes with your children and revisit the Matrix with them. There is a copy of our expectations every week in this newsletter.

Book Fare:



James receives a certificate and a boxed set of Derwent pencils as his prize.




TRYING SOMETHING NEW

Starting school is a new experience. Because of COVID-19 children have not been able to try new things this year.

Trying new and different things may be a bit scary for children this year.

Exploring ideas and places can be great fun.

How to get to know your child's new school.

- Talk to them about school next year in a positive way
- Tell them their teacher's name when you know it
- If you or your child can't visit the schoolground this year due to COVID-19 restrictions, ask the school for pictures of the playground and your child's classroom
- Walk by their school for next year
- Make sure your child attends the orientation sessions your school is running
- Make a "Starting School" book and read it to your child regularly

This week can be a good time to start exploring new ideas and places. Things to try:

- Go to a new playground
- Organise a playdate with other children
- Play a new game together
- Make up a fun new game together
- Make something new from Lego or play dough
- Read a new book together – check out your local library (a library is also a great new place to go!)
