Hello everyone,

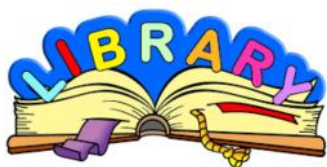
Well as I am writing this newsletter we are in full NAPLAN mode. We have completed the first 2 assessments of writing and language conventions. Today was reading and tomorrow will be numeracy to complete the assessments. In August we will be receiving the results of the tests. Parents will receive a copy of their child's results which will have an explanation of how to read them. If parent have any queries about the results please come and see Trudie or myself so we can clarify any misunderstandings. The school will be looking at individual results, cohort data and whole school data to better direct our teaching for the next 12 months by analysing areas of weakness.

District Cross Country Championships are on Friday at Nagle College this week. The school is sending a team of 36 students from the 3 - 6 grades. Mr O'Brien will be organising the day so Mr Hathaway and myself will be with the students, organising them. The distances on the day are the same as our school cross country. 9/10yrs run 2kms, 11yrs run 3kms and 12/13yrs also run 3 kms. Good luck to all the competitors on the day, I know they will be great representatives for our school.



Next Thursday the 24th of May the Grade 5/6 students will be venturing down to Paynesville to compete in the District Winter Sports. Your child will compete in either T-ball, soccer or netball. The students are currently being sorted into teams.

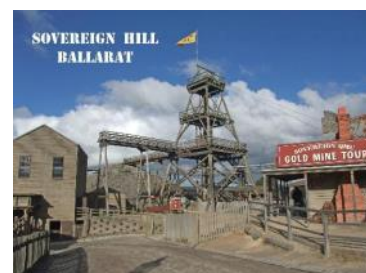


School Absences:

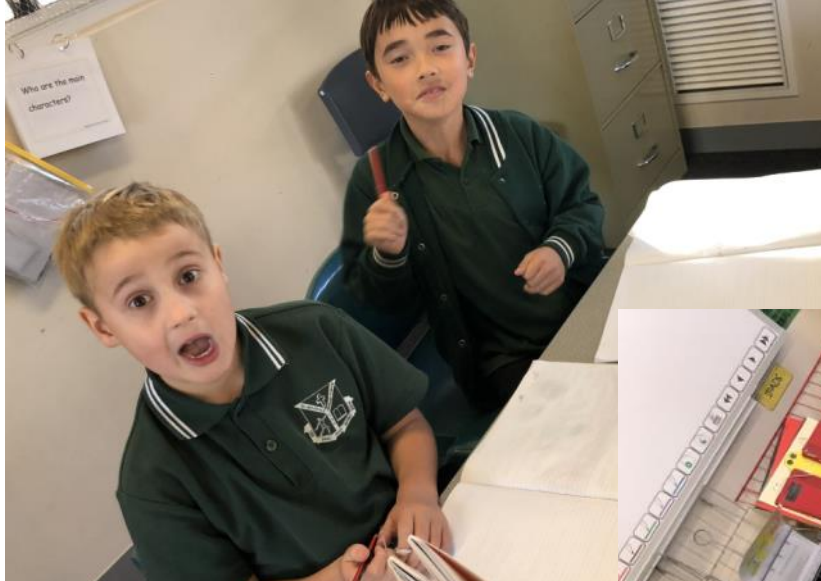
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Student Awards

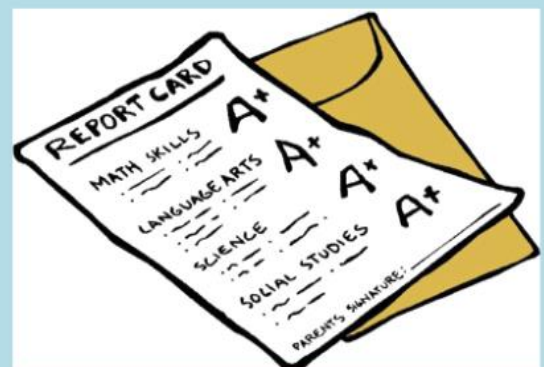

How to place a Lunch Order

Write the lunch order on a clean brown paper bag and remember to include: Child's name, Class and room number.

Place the money inside the bag and try to include the 'correct amount' if you require change - it will be placed in the bag and returned to your child with their lunch.

Lunch orders are placed in the 'lunch basket' located in each classroom.

The Class Monitor takes the basket to the Office in the morning at 9.00am, and then collects the basket from the canteen at first break to be delivered to the classroom.

If you don't have a paper bag, write your child's order on an envelope with the money enclosed - add 20 cents for the cost of the bag.

Frozen items cannot be included in lunch orders and need to be purchased at the Canteen directly.
