Week 10 Term 2

Good afternoon from "Education Central"! Welcome to week 10, as we scamper to complete all the required work for term 2.

SEVR Conference – On Thursday and Friday of last week, Warwick and I joined all the other Principal and Assistant Principal's from all across South East Victoria Region, 1000 people in total. We met at the Melbourne Conference Centre and enjoyed 2 days of fantastic professional development. Thanks to Jarrod Vague, who "stepped up" for the 2 days, Jarrod has an interest in leadership roles and this was the perfect chance for him to have a "taste". One of the sessions that I most enjoyed was listening to the Deputy Secretary for Education, Bruce Armstrong. He is a wonderful presenter and spoke of how we can go about Unleashing the Greatness of the Public education sector. I also enjoyed listening to the story of Maryborough Education Centre, a school that has 1000 students and is a school who caters for special needs students and is also P to 12 school. Very complicated

setting and very interesting story to tell of development, difficulty and improvement.

Community Consultation Night - This night will occur on Wednesday the 25th of July. This is week 2 of Term 3. This event has been so successful over the last 2 years, that we have decided to

make it an annual event. It is an opportunity for our parent community to come along and give us direct feedback on many aspects of the school. Each table for discussion will have a Principal from another school in our area, a staff member from 754, a student or two, a member of our school council and of course parents. I will pose a series of questions to the table for discussion and then we follow up the feedback given. Please put this date in your diaries and I look forward to seeing you on the

night. If you could please contact the office to let us know your intention to come along, then we will more easily be able to cater (nibbles) and arrange table numbers. Thanks!

Attendance: As I am sure you know, we have employed an attendance officer from the start of the year. The purpose is that direct contact is made with every family, where their child has not arrived at school for the day. As an update, our attendance rates are improving significantly and yesterday there were only 2 children (from almost 250) that we couldn't account for. That doesn't mean all those children are at school – we totally understand that students get sick, but we knew where they all were except for 2. Those families had a message left on their

Reports! Please make sure to keep an eye out for your child's report, these will be sent home with the students on Thursday next week. I know that some families have asked about collecting these earlier and we will accommodate this where we can. I am still in the process of reading and making a comment on the reports, as I know Warwick is too.

How can you help your children's learning progress?

This is a huge question, that truly has a couple of easy responses.

Always completing the "Big Talk" is very important. This is part of the VCOP program, where at home the families support their children by discussing the topic for the Big Write – which will occur the next morning. As I walked through the junior and middle school buildings today I asked how many children had "filled their heads with ideas" last night? –sadly, not enough. (Perhaps 50%) If all families could support this program, by just discussing the topic whilst setting up for dinner, or during dinner etc it will greatly benefit your children's success during the Big Write. I am happy to discuss this with any family, if you need more detail.



The other way you can always support your child's learning progress is reading every night. It doesn't have to be for long, just 10 or 15 minutes will be enough – this will encourage, an enjoyment of language, books and greatly develop their oral language. I heard it described recently as "Enjoying the wonderful magic of sharing a beautifully written book"!

Something to ponder: What will your family be doing over the holidays? It would be nice if we all had the finances to jet off to warmer weather etc but there are many things that are completely free of any charge. Please be sure to keep up the "brain skills" of your children. Read every day – a wide variety of written material, practise your number facts / timetables every day – regardless of the grade you are in and play loads of board games! Have fun!

The challenge is to collect as many silver coins as you can to make the longest line. The class who makes the longest line will win hot chips for lunch on the last day of term 2


