Week 1 Term 3 - 2019

Good afternoon and welcome back to school. Three days have rushed by in a "heart beat".



Monday was a student free day where the staff worked together on a number of topics. We investigated "Student Voice" – This is how we provide the opportunities for children in our classes to have their "voice heard" around their learning. If the students feel that their voice is valued and acted on, then they are far more likely Voice to really engage deeply in their learning AND that's exactly what we want. The discussion, thoughts and possibilities that grew from the conversation was really great, and certainly time well spent.

The second session of the day was about maximising the way we use two key programs in the school. (Mathletics and Reading eggs/Reading eggspress) Both of these programs have so many elements and applications, plus they are evolving all the time - so we need to be sure that we are abreast of all the updates to ensure we are using each program to its maximal potential – to get maximum benefit for the students.

The staff opinion survey results from 2018 were unpacked, in preparation for the 2019 survey. All staff will be completing this across the next week.

This is also a "heads up" that the 2019 Parent Opinion Survey will be open for parents to complete between Monday 22 July and Sunday 11 August. Every family will have a unique password to complete this online and I will get these to you as soon as possible. This is your opportunity to have a say on the different elements that make up school life!



The last section of Monday's program was around the Save the Children's Parenting Program that will kick off on August 28th. This is a very successful program that we have run before. If you are interested in learning more, there are pamphlets at the office.



Community Consultation Night – this event is scheduled for the 21st August. Please put this date in your diary, as it is another key opportunity for you to have direct input into the school.

I have also been asking (across the last few newsletters) for some input around the topics for the consultation night - do you have any others? If so, just email me or drop them to the office – Thanks.

Senior Girls soccer: This morning I was able to go along and support our senior girls soccer team. They played off in the second round of the winter sports against TUBBS (Tambo Upper, Buchan and Bruthen combined team). Despite it being freezing cold, the girls played a great game.
