Week 2 Term 3 - 2019

Good afternoon and welcome to week 2 of the third term!

This week we have received back our Student opinion survey results – and I am very pleased to say that I couldn't be happier! Every result for every element: was given an approval rating by the students in the high 80th percentile and in the 90's! One even go 100% approval – yippy!



The topics that the students have answered questions on, range from: excellence in teaching and learning, the positive climate of the school, teacher – student relationships, social engagements, student safety and more. The data can be broken down into year levels (grades 4, 5 and 6) and female and male responses. This coming Wednesday I will work with each small group to discuss their responses in greater depth.

This is a key piece of work when giving all students "voice" to have positive and effective input into their schooling.

Speaking of Surveys – the Parent opinion survey opened up for you on Monday. The Parent Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training that is conducted amongst a large sample of parents. It is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of parents' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour and student engagement. We will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies. All responses to the survey are completely anonymous. This year the Parent Opinion Survey will be conducted from **Monday 22rd July** to **Sunday 11th August**.

The survey will be conducted **online**, only takes **10-15 minutes** to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the fieldwork period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The survey results will be reported back to the school at the end of September. Thanks!

The staff survey has also been completed, so by September we should have all 3 key survey's back.


