Week 3 Term 3 - 2019

Good afternoon all; Welcome to week 3 of the term.

Hey – have you read today's paper? Yes, we are in it recognising the outstanding work the school (in this case mainly Shelly Freer) has been doing with Dr Saba (Paediatrician) around supporting families to engage via Teleconferencing. This saves families having to travel to Sale, saving time and money, plus speeds the ability to connect with the needed medical services – well done Shelly. "Check it out".

I am also super excited to tell you that we have been selected as 1 of 12 schools around the state for a significant Internet upgrade pilot program. This is around understanding the critical role that internet bandwidth plays with regard to educational learning outcomes and our school will help the Department to establish a better way of connecting all schools. What are the benefits to 754 and its students? The connection speed of the new internet service would be 5 times greater than your current service at a minimum. Cloud-based internet filtering will provide improved management and visibility of the content consumed by your students. Enhanced technical support for the duration of the pilot, plus additional technician support hours where required. This is fantastic news and yet another example of the continuous drive for constant improvement at our school. I'll be sure to keep you informed as this rolls out.



Parent Opinion survey: I have spoken with several parents regarding this survey. If you have received one (via your email) can you please be sure to complete this. It provides vital information for us to work with, again to constantly improve. If you need any assistance, please speak to me or either Jenny or Tracey will be able to help you at the office.



Today I have worked with the student group (in small groups of grade level and boys and girls separately) to unpack what each of them said via the student survey – looking for clear understanding and an opportunity to provide student voice to the data. One of the key areas identified was the amount of cyber "nasty business" that happens at home, in particular amongst the grade 5 and 6 girls.

We are once again participating in Jeans for Genes Day which is taking place this year on Friday 2nd August. Generous support by the Central Gippsland Health (CGH) Paediatric Telehealth Service will allow Bairnsdale Primary School to undertake valuable, online Paediatric consultations.

Funded by the State Government, the CGH Paediatric Telehealth Service is providing a laptop and trolley to the school to thank Bairnsdale Primary School for its ongoing support and participation in the telehealth project, which concluded at the end of June.

The integrated CGH Paediatric Telehealth Service is led by consultant Paediatrician and Head of Unit, Dr Saba Subiramanian. A key goal of the service is to provide timely and appropriate care for children in the Wellington and East Gippsland regions. This service includes, but is not limited to, outpatients and inpatients in these regions.

The Paediatric Telehealth Project focused on the novel concept of delivering specialist care to children at primary schools in East Gippsland, involving key stakeholders including the parents, educators and school support staff, and minimising disruptions to the daily activities of the child and family unit. This collaborative care model has proven to be successful, and development of relationships with teachers and support staff will continue beyond the duration of the project.

Telehealth Project Officer, Sue Dobson, said the benefits of the service were immense with a particular saving on travel costs and time.

"The Telehealth Service provides direct benefits for patients, families and carers such as time and costs savings in terms of travel, time off work and school, and disruption to routine," she explained.

The Paediatric Telehealth Service means families can make an online appointment with a specialist doctor and the entire consultation is conducted via a secure IT platform on the internet.

"This computer on wheels (COW) will allow Bairnsdale Primary School to undertake Telehealth consultations in any room that suits, offering the freedom and flexibility of choice to ensure video calls are always undertaken in a suitably quiet and private space free from distractions."

Over the period of the CGH Paediatric Telehealth Project, its 264 patients and families have saved 58,527kms in travel, which is equivalent to driving around the coast of Australia four times.

"This also translates to savings of \$8824 and 3099 tonnes of CO2 emissions," Ms Dobson said.

Overall, a successful Paediatric Telehealth program has been embedded. Telemedicine is now a commonplace practice worldwide, and there is potential for expansion into adult specialist and allied health services.
