My something to ponder comes here today: When you sit and read a book, I would like to encourage you (and of course model for your children) to have a paper and pen at hand to jot down what you are thinking about the authors intention behind the characters. Why they are in the story, why they behave in a certain way, what is the reason behind this strategy being used by the author? This is reflecting on one aspect of the craft of writing, not the writing itself!

On Monday we will be able to welcome back Meg Langley! Meg has had a considerable amount to time away due to her hip operation, but I am pleased to say that she is now "back on her feet"! Next week will be a hand over week, with Mr Fraser, Kate Allen and Meg all working in 3/4B together to ensure the smoothest and most effective transition possible for the students.






