came along to enjoy the fun! A wonderful success and a great opportunity for the community to come and share the work of our students.


Thursday this week we have invited 2 Principals from other local schools to come and join our senior students in a discussion around, school, classes and the playground and how they think we can continue to strive for constant improvement. The senior students will be made up of our school captains from semester 1 and 2, plus 3 grade 5 students who were eager to join in. This represents the second wave of student feedback, the first coming from unpacking the attitude to school survey that students completed last term.

Please remember to complete your Parent survey, this was emailed to families 2 weeks ago with reminder letters sent home to you last week. When I last checked we had only 32 responses from

a possible 125, so we need your support to have accurate information that reflects fairly across the parent body. The survey will ask questions around 19 elements that fall under 6 umbrella terms: Parent Community Engagement, Student Cognitive Development, Student Development, Safety, Connection and Progress plus School Ethos and Environment. I am excited about these results, as we have shown significant

growth over the last 3 years and we look forwards to this trend continuing. The survey will take approximately 10 min to complete.

The 754 Athletics is this Friday – so instead of a rain dance, can you please do a warm day and sunshine dance! Howitt Park is cold and windy, so rug up to stay warm.




