Newsletter week 8 Term 3

Good afternoon all: The weeks roll around very quickly indeed, as we reach the half way point of week 8, term 3. This term we have been running a program where either member of the leadership team will drop into classes to provide some feedback to the teacher on the following questions we have been putting forward to the children:

- (1) What are you learning by completing this task? This is looking for targeted learning intentions and making sure that the children understand their learning goals.
- (2) How do you now if you are doing a great job or not? Children need to understand what a great piece of work looks like. This is the success criteria.
- (3) What is it that you need to do to improve? This is focusing on children knowing, what is the next step in their learning.
- (4) If you need some help, how would you get that help? Being able to source help to a problem in a variety of ways, is encouraging independent learners.

The process is very informative and the responses from the children show a varied degree of understanding. This highlights the next steps for us as teachers to maximise student engagement and understanding in their learning. If you would like to understand more of what we are achieving via this work, I am happy to chat to you at any time.

The Whole School Production is a major focus in the classrooms at the minute. I know that tickets are selling fast at the office and I am really looking forward to seeing my first 754 show. The children learn such fantastic skills by being part of a production and sometimes it is just about being brave and accepting the challenge of being out of your comfort zone.

A grade 2 girl asked me the other day if she could wear the colours of her local footy team? – Absolutely! Go Wy Yung! Boite Combined Schools Choir:


