Newsletter Week 7 Term 1 2018

Hello and welcome to week 7 of the term! As is always the case we have plenty happening this week – When 300 people per day come together to teach, learn and play – there is always "something going on"!

Today we are have a special visit from Debbie Locco (The Director for School Improvement for the South Eastern Victorian Region SEVR) and Tony Roberts (Local Senior Education Improvement Leader SEIL). I am thrilled that these guys are coming to tour our school. We are being "spoken about" far and wide – with all our elements of significant school improvement. All the staff and kids have worked really hard and we are truly beginning to reap the benefits. Today's visit will specifically focus on: Our playground and SWPBS, excellent teaching in classrooms and improving student outcomes.

The work of our attendance Officer is also showing significant improvements in the attendance of our students. Very happy with this, but, we also need to address the number of children who arrive late. We need to set the expectations right from day 1. Classes begin at **8.50am** sharp and the children are expected to be here at 8.30am ready to go. As an example – 6 children arrived to the Prep room yesterday at 9.00am. This is after rolls have been marked and the classroom has begun. Now I am going to sound like I'm never happy – I don't mean to be, but the other extreme is that we have children arriving in the yard at 7.30am in the morning. This is far too early, in fact an hour early and there is definitely no supervision at this time. Thanks – We appreciate your support in improving this element of our school.



If you walk past the Junior building today and hear chirping – then you will be on the way to meeting our newest students! 10 chickens! This is forming the science component of the junior school program, with the Life Cycle of a chicken. So far, they have heard eggs, turn into live babies ready to hatch, then pipping, then shells breaking and now 10 little babies! So cute and the kids seem to be loving it! Great job – Junior team.

Violence is never acceptable! Really, this is just a non-negotiable. I was disappointed to see four boys in a "punch up" yesterday. Why? Truly it was just because they became frustrated with a disagreement and turned to hitting. Not ok and never acceptable. There are of course consequences to follow, but if again you could please support us by taking the time to discuss with your children, the variety of ways to solve an issue without violence.

Parent Teacher interviews are fast approaching, so please make sure that you make an appointment time to discuss your child's progress with their teacher. Times are available, either Thursday night or Friday until 1pm. You can book through compass or just call to the office and Tracey or jenny will be happy to help you. The expectation is simple: Your child should attend with you as they are the topic of discussion and every family needs to attend. Staff will be able to show progress, Individual learning plans and discuss any concerns, plus celebrate successes.

Day 1 Term 2 – this will be a **student free day** - No school for the kids until the Tuesday 17th April. All staff will attend on this day with the focus being on **"How reading works**" at 754". We will look at the programs we are delivering, what is working well and what we can improve on. We have a constant emphasis on making all students better readers – this is a life time essential skill.

School Council AGM – This Thursday night is the first meeting of the new Council for 2018. I must say a huge thank you to those councillors who are finishing up this year, Lisa Carter and Anna Walker. All school council members give up their time to work as a team to always try and access the best outcomes for the children at 754. Thanks again, your efforts are much appreciated and of-course, you are welcome back anytime.

Something to ponder: What has changed since you were a kid? Believe me, lots since I was 10 years of age! Take the time to discuss with your children what school was like then, How play times have changed and imagine - how did we survive without the internet and mobile phones? Ha – enjoy the walk down memory lane!














