WOW what a big term we have had! It started all the way back on the 30th of January when we had the first day with our students at school. There were lots of happy faces and a couple of sad faces, from the parents, to see all the children starting the new year. Of course, the biggest excitement is always around the Prep room as they begin their primary school education. Within a couple of week we were all at the pool, competing in the school swimming sports, quickly followed up a week later with the District Swimming Sports. In between we had a wonderful maths incursion around problem solving, that challenged students and teachers alike to think outside the box. This painted maths in a different light to how many of our students see maths. Thanks to the hard work of the maths team for organising the day.

After the long weekend the 5/6s began the sailing program. Everyone had great sessions, with Ms Bell exclaiming, "It was the BEST day ever!" Students grew in confidence, independence and belief in their own abilities to try something new and challenging. The following week, in response to our Community Consultation Evening, we held a Literacy and Numeracy Information evening to explain how we teach these areas and what programs we use. We also looked at why we are a No Homework School and where parents could find homework if they felt it necessary. The following day was Harmony Day, which promoted cultural diversity within the wider community and the world community. It was a great day and the work produced now lines the hallway of the main building.

Very quickly the 5/6s were off to Melbourne for their annual camp. This is a new camp that has replaced the tractional Canberra camp due to price and the fact on the 4 day Canberra Camp 2 of



the days were spent in a bus getting there and back. It was judged a resounding success by the students and the staff, who had little time to breathe as they walked around 30 kms over the 4 days and faced the challenge of catching trams and trains at peak times. There were highlights every day but mine is always going to the Queen Victoria Market and seeing

the students, wide eyed, going through the stall and learning how to spend their money wisely.

I was very proud of Pippa donating her hair on Monday at assembly and it was fun to see the students get dressed up in their PJs to raise money for a worthy cause. Well done Pippa.


