#### Looking at Behaviour

Simply stated, behaviours are actions or conditions that can be observed. The majority of human behaviours are desirable and necessary for individuals or groups to function productively and safely.

These desirable behaviours will typically continue to occur because they are strengthened by the outcome of the behaviour itself. For example, a person looks at you, smiles, then says "Good morning". You then respond by smiling back and returning the greeting. Because of your response, that person is more likely to greet you in a similar fashion the next time.

However, when undesirable behaviours occur they too may continue depending upon the response. Generally, the reaction to a given problem behaviour will strengly determine if that problem behaviour can be modified to something more desirable, or if the condition becomes an even bigger challenge for everyone involved.


