End of Year

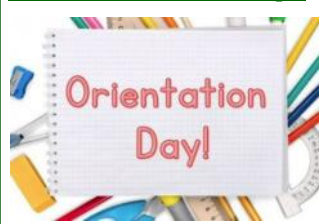

Last day of School:

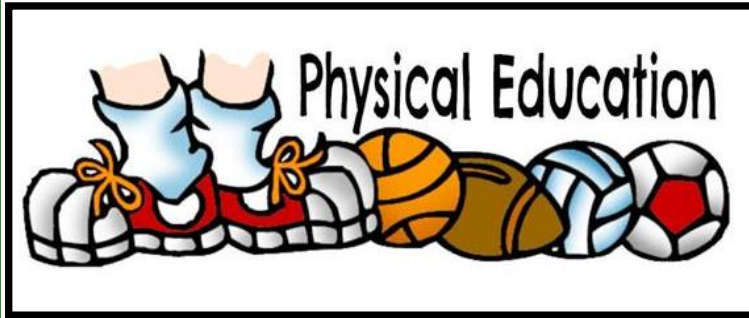
The last day of school for students will be Wednesday 18th December with a finish time of **3.15pm**

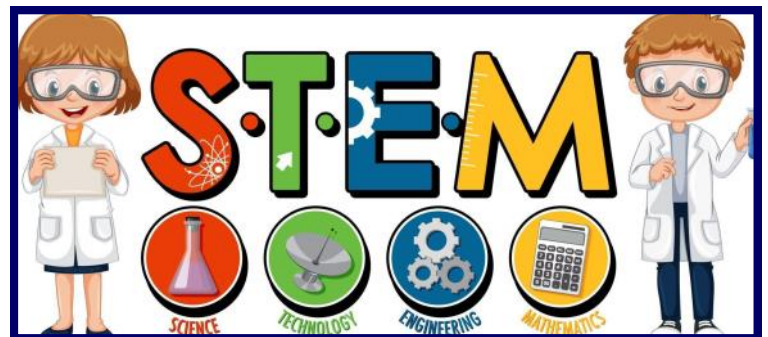

We are once again collecting donations for our end of year Christmas Hamper Raffle.

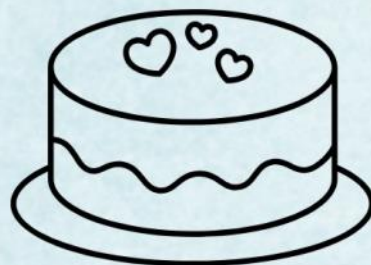
Please leave a small Christmas gift or non-perishable Christmas food item for our hamper at the School Office.

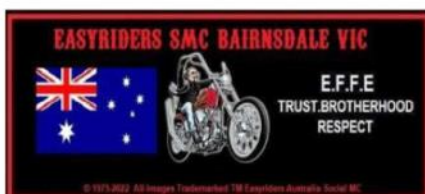
