Welcome to week 9, Term 1.

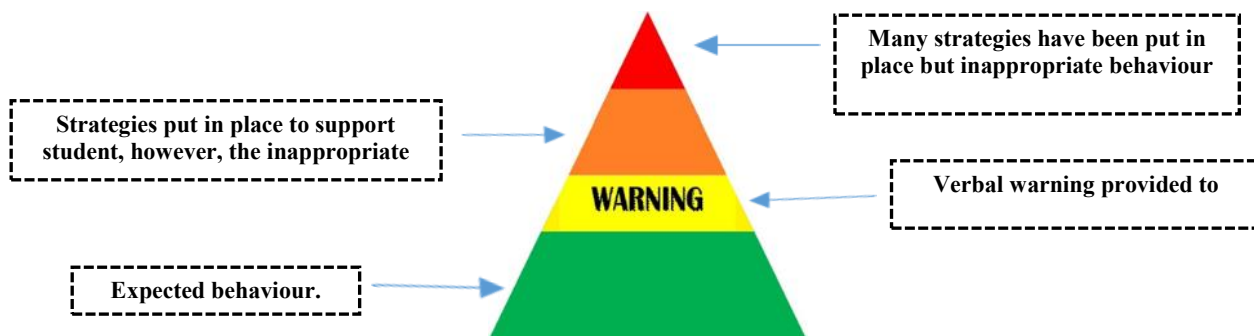

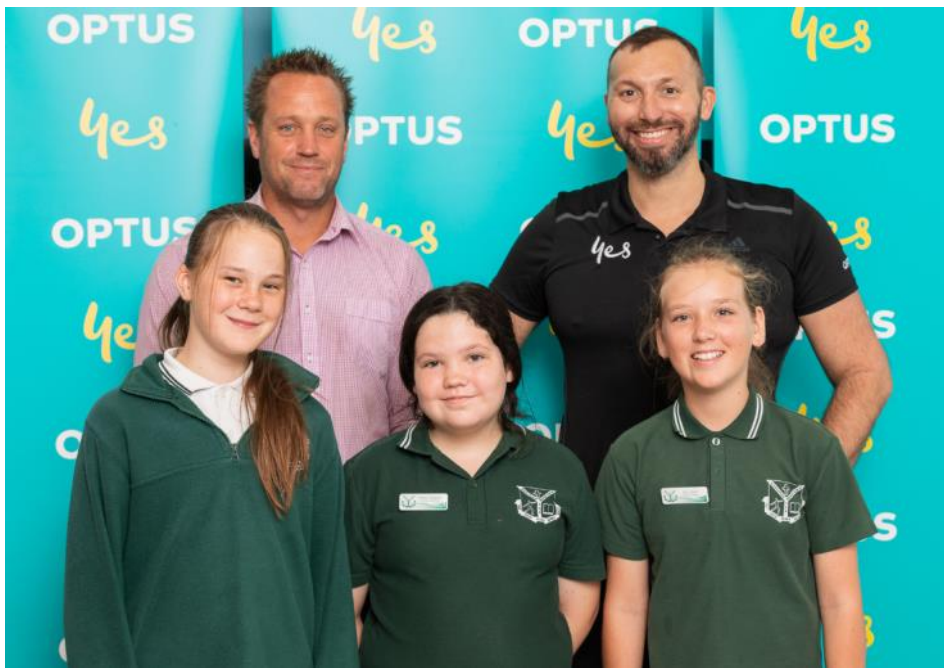
