### Principal's Message Week 8 Term 3 - 2019

Good morning to you all; "We smashed it out



of the park" - Please forgive my sporting analogy but I am referring to our 2019 Naplan results. If you had seen me in the hallways yesterday skipping, then you may

have had a heads up! Given our outstanding results of last year, I must

confess to being a little nervous about getting the same "kick" again – but we have indeed. One key area is 'growth" – that is how much the children have improved from their grade 3 result to their Grade 5 result. It doesn't reflect that you

are the top score, or a low score - it is totally about how much you have improved, learnt, grown over the 2 year period. We grew at a rate significantly more than across the state in each area - reading, writing, spelling, grammar and punctuation and last but most certainly not least – Numeracy! In terms of keeping our students in the top 2 levels in the state and maintaining that level of performance, we have again out shone the state in every element, bar one, (we missed writing by a smidge!). If your child is in grades 3 or 5, you can collect their individual Naplan results from the office from today. I would be very happy to speak to you and explain the score card – just ask. On Monday of next week any cards still at the office will be sent home with the students. I am so proud of our kids and all the staff!

The grade 3 / 4 camp at Coolamatong left this morning in beautiful sunshine and the atmosphere was high! These guys will have a great time and I am sure all will return Friday, puffed, dirty and really tired! I must thank the staff involved, as it really is a huge ask to be on duty 24 hours a day for 3
